Brother to Brother (B2B)/ Sister to Sister (S2S) Program

Brother to Brother Program

The mission of Brother to Brother Program is to better academic opportunities and performance of adolescent males of color between the ages of 11-18 years of age. We are dedicated, to helping young men go onto higher education, by providing them with: mentoring, academic enrichment workshops, manhood training, job training and academic resources. These initiatives are developed to prepare young men to be both qualified college applicants, as well as, trained job seekers. It is our belief, that through these initiatives, we will be able to promote both responsibility and leadership skills among program participants that will help them in the: classroom, their family, community, and in life.

The **Brother to Brother Program** will consist of the following four (4) components:

- Mentoring

The mentoring program provides program participants with an upstanding male of color who serves as a big brother. Each big brother pledges to set a good moral, academic and community example for their little brother.

- Dress to Impress

The professional development program provides the young men with professional etiquette course. We will instruct the young men on professional attire, and outline the do's and don'ts of an interview. Whether interviewing for a job or college admission – this workshop will give program participants the skills needed to stand out from the crowd.

- “Give Back”

The community service program is devoted to helping our young men give back to their community. We will find various volunteer opportunities and internships where our young men can learn the value of community service and social uplift within their communities.

- Chill Time

The recreational program will provide culturally enrichment and extracurricular activities. Students will be able to attend professional sporting events, college sporting events, dining and college outreach programs.

Sister to Sister Program

The Sister to Sister Program is similar to Brother to Brother with the primary focus on female issues and activities.

PROPOSAL

GOAL: To offer an academically based and culturally enriching summer camp to students who are unable to afford traditional summer camp programs currently available. The “Spirit of Excellence” camp provides a structured alternative to socio-economically disadvantaged youth who otherwise have no other options for supervision, educational and cultural enrichment for the summer.

OBJECTIVE: To provide a six week (6) week, fulltime (5 days a week, 8 hours per day) summer camp will provide academic and cultural enrichment. The camp will focus on education, etiquette and manners, values and life skills training and drug and crime prevention.

POPULATION: 75 students (Priority given to CAFCC Youths)

COST: \$20.00 per week / per child

MEALS

Breakfast and Lunch will be provided by school summer meal program. Otherwise, children will need to provide their own breakfast and lunch.
